Brenda submitted paperwork for 50 boxes at \$1,500 and Hidden in Plain Sight \$950. ○ Brenda passed out a Sheet with data and how the CPWI grant has been impacting the community ○ DFC Year 7 Vote: ○ Brenda asked for ideas or feed back, Brenda went over what we are using the grant for. Some examples include but not limited to: Prevention Club, Evaluations, Community Talks (Town Hall), Logic Models, Youth Focus Groups, Retailer checks, Communication plan, Conferences, Parents who host lose the most. We wanted to look into Quinceanera changing attitudes-One at a time program. ○ Brenda asked for an propositions or any changes. ○ Brenda asked if anyone wanted to vote or make any changes ○ Brenda went over the budget and mentioned that some things can change and others can't.
